Thank you for being a vital part of our community. Your dedication inspires us to continue empowering the next generation of leaders.

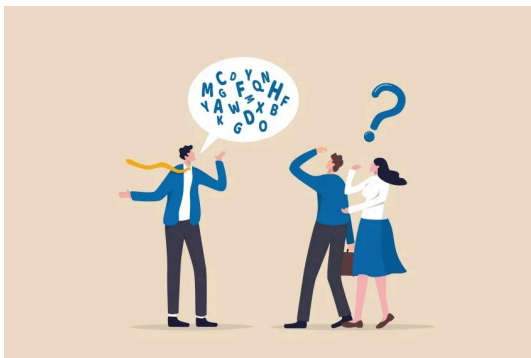

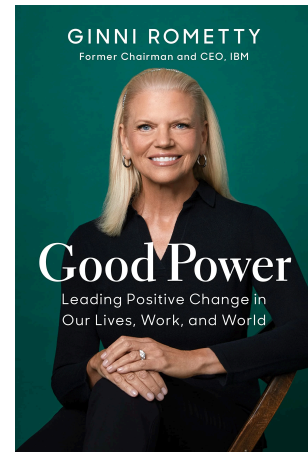
